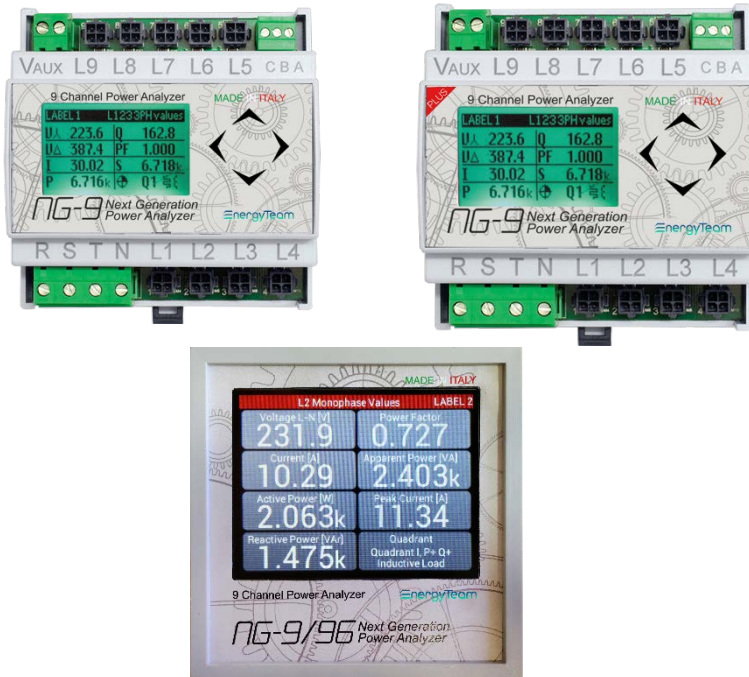



IMPORTANT NOTE

The instrument is already supplied assembled. With regard to the location, it must always be inserted inside an electrical panel by DIN rail mounting.

We suggest to insert on the Voltage Inputs or a fuse-holder (250mA, delayed fuses) or a 6A magneto-thermal switch.

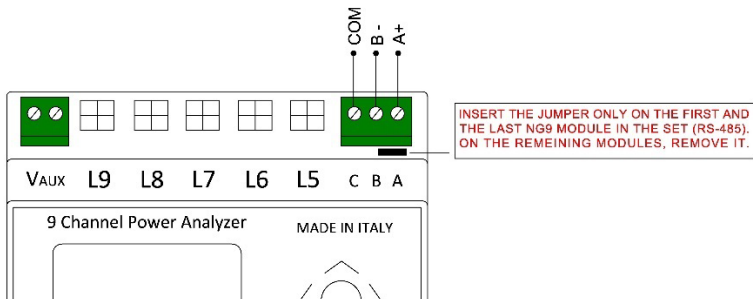

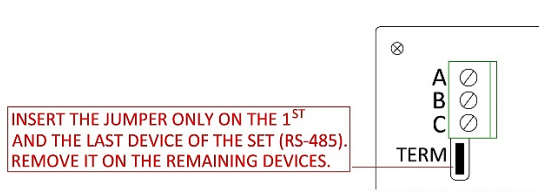

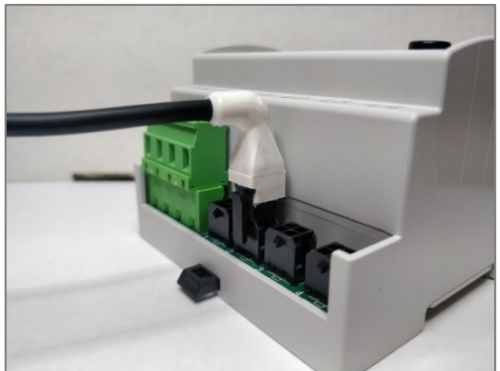
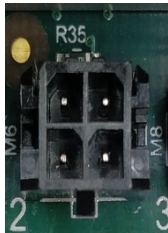
To insert correctly the sensors, the connector must have the flap facing outwards, as shown in the images below.

Align the 2 connectors and press. It is not necessary to press hard during this operation; press until you hear the tongue snap into the connector on NG9 / NG9-Plus.

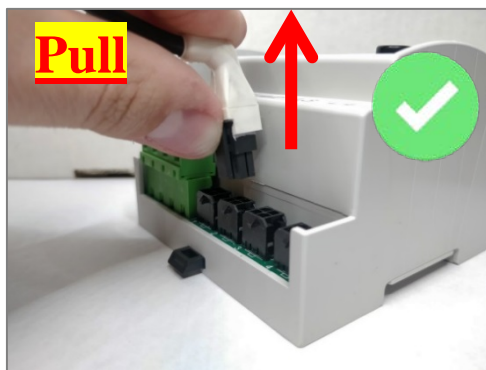
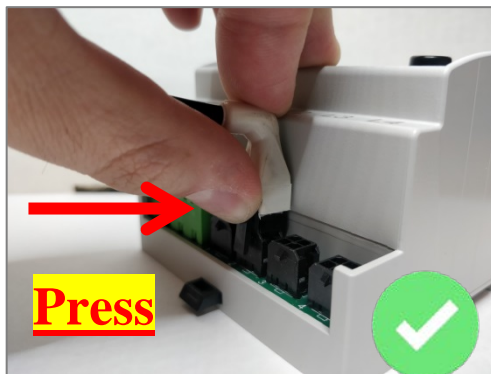

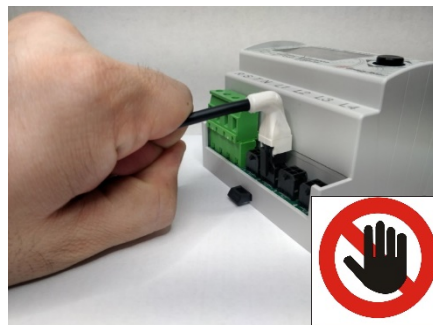


Sensor removal

Should it be necessary to remove the sensors connected to the NG9 / NG9 Plus due to incorrect installations or repairs, proceed as follows:

Press the flap with your thumb and, applying light force, pull the connector upwards.





- Never force the mechanism, using objects such as scissors, pliers, screwdrivers ecc.
- Never use force to pull the connector.
- Never pull the connector from the cable.

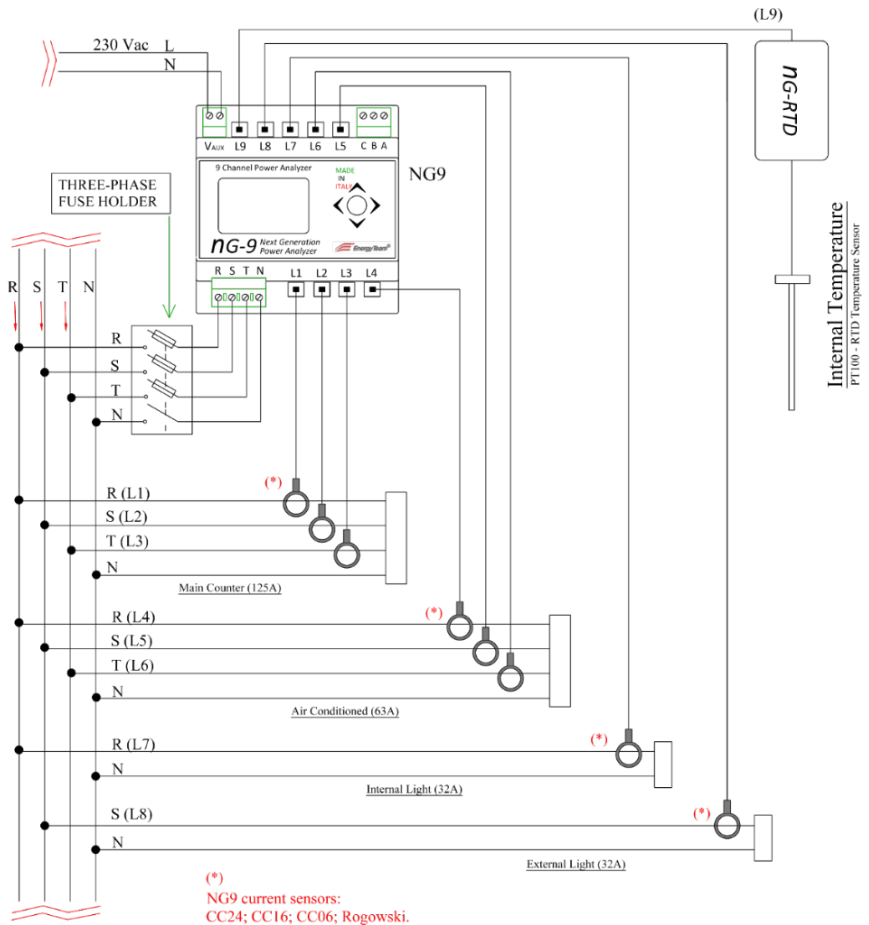


EXAMPLE OF ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS

Example of plant with NG-RTD sensor

We suppose to monitor a plant like the one shown below, with 2 Three-phase systems, 2 Single-phase systems and a RTD sensor.

ATTENTION: NG-RTD sensors can be used only with NG-9 PLUS and NG9/96.



L1-L2-L3 Main counter (125A)

In order to monitor the first load, we should use Rogowski Coils. Usually the wires going out from the main counter are bigger than 24 mm (maximum diameter possible with NG9 CT). Since the maximum current of the load is 125A, we can use the Rogowski Coil with 100 mm of diameter and 2000A as maximum current range.

L4-L5-L6 Air conditioned (63A)

In this case, we will assume that the diameter of the cable is less than 24 mm and the maximum current load is 63A. We can use a CC24 sensor (with diameter 24 mm).

L7 Internal light (32A)

In this case, we will assume that the diameter of the cable is less than 16 mm and the maximum current load is 32A. We can use a CC16 sensor (with diameter 16 mm).

L8 External light (32A)

In this case, we will assume that wire diameter is under 16 mm and since the maximum current range is 32 A for a mono phase load we will use a single CC16 sensor

L9 External temperature (PT100)

In the field is present a temperature sensor, a PT100. We can choose to install NG9 in the Plus Version with the NG-RTD sensor calibrated to work with the PT100 (NG-RTD sensors are available upon request calibrated with different set of RTD sensors).

Inside “*System setup*” of NG9-PLUS, we will select first the correct Insertion Mode, by reaching the menu, pressing enter and choosing the 2 three-phase and 3 mono-phase type mode. Then we select the sensor type and current range choosing from the table, for every NG9 Plus Channel from L1 to L9, through the specific section of System Setup Menu. Obviously, we can do the same thing for NG9 in the normal version, excluding the RTD sensor.

- For L1 – L2 – L3 channels we will select ***RG2K 200A f.s.***
- For L4 – L5 – L6 channels we will select ***CC24 100A f.s.***
- For L7 channel we will select ***CC16 40A f.s.***
- For L8 channel we will select ***CC16 40A f.s.***
- For L9 channel we will select ***RTD.***

ATTENTION: As you can see in the schematic, the Single-phase loads monitored through the sensors going in L7 and L8 channels, share the same Voltage phase. In this case, we should set the same voltage phase as reference inside NG9 plus menu. We should use this function only when two (or more) Single-phase channels are sharing the same Voltage phase. When considering Three-phase systems that don't match correspondence between current sensor and Voltage Phases, we should resolve the issues changing the wiring itself or changing the sensor position in order to match the correct Voltage phase.

To configure properly the NG9 reading, let's change Voltage Phase assigned to channel L8. After sensor configuration procedure, remain inside *System Setup* menu and scroll down until you reach this page:



From this page, scroll down until you reach *L9 Voltage Channel* page and select V2 (S) voltage channel.

After those steps, NG9 will need to be rebooted in order to apply the changes. Turn off the device and power it on again immediately or perform the software *Reboot* procedure.

From main menu, move the Joystick downwards until to display the menu about the Single-phase measurements.

RTD means "Resistance Temperature Detector" and, usually, it's made by a thin wire wrapped around a ceramic center (even if other methods are used). RTD sensor cable is in pure material, usually platinum, nickel or copper; all materials with high Resistance/Temperature ratio, used for indication of temperature. RTD elements are quite fragile and therefore are often protected by protective probes.

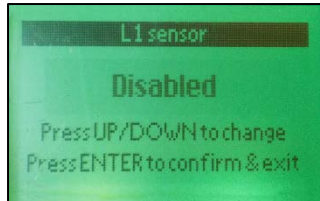
As described in the paragraph about the technical features, NG-RTD accepts the sensors type: RTD PT100, PT200, PT500 e PT1000. When you decide to buy the RG-RTD interface, you also must specify the type of sensors to be used. The device doesn't adapt automatically to different types of resistive

sensors, because Energy-Team must calibrate the device, so as to adapt correctly the probe resistance.

Once the correct version of NG-RTD has been purchased, all you need to do is to connect the probe to the device; NG9 PLUS will begin immediately to acquire Temperature values.

From System Setup menu, move the joystick downwards until to display the menu about the selection of the sensor, for each channel.

In this example, Channel L1 is used:



Press ENTER (central button) and move the joystick downwards until to display NG-RTD menu:



Press ENTER to confirm.

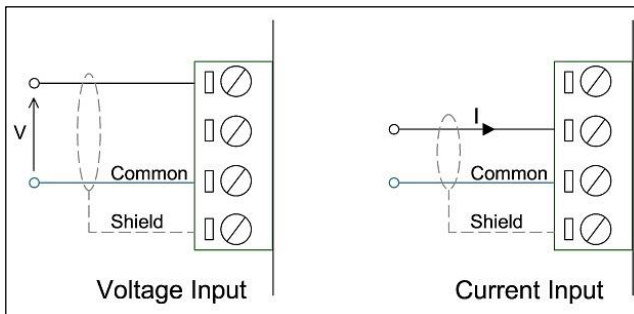

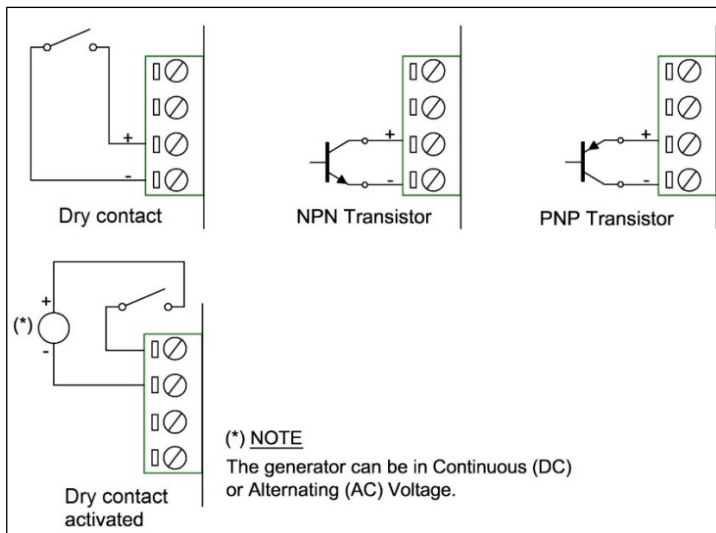

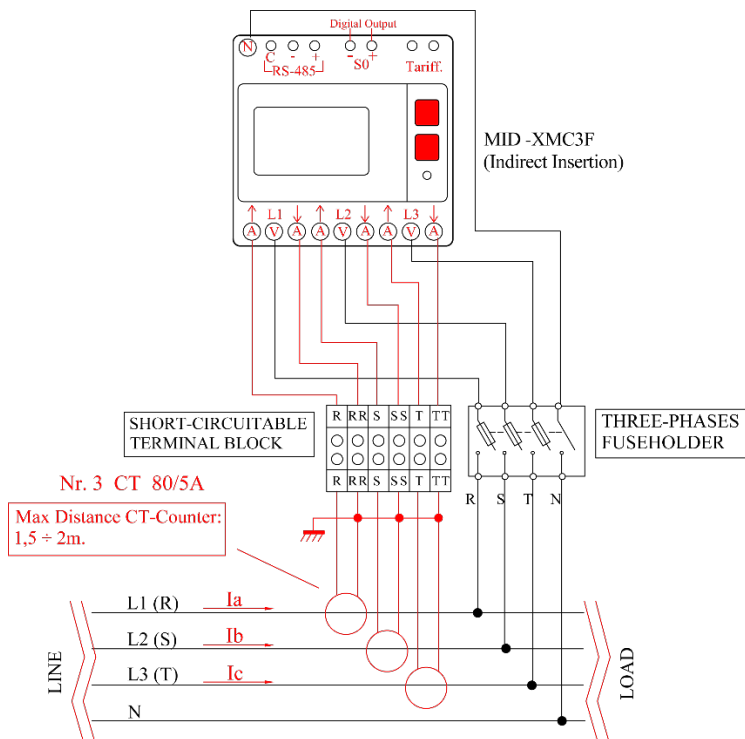


Example of plant with NG-DIG sensor.

Acquisition of digital signals from a Counter of Electrical energy MID-XMC3F of Energy Team, in its semi-direct configuration. This configuration is described below:

- MID-XMC3F with current transformers 80/5A on a three-phase system.
- NG-9 PLUS with NG-DIG sensor on the MID-XMC3F digital Output .

First, you must connect the Counter's digital output (SO) to NG-DIG sensor according the scheme below:



After connecting the digital output of the counter to NG-DIG sensor, you must insert the reading parameters on the Counter technical data sheet. You must get the weight of the pulse in Output for each unit of measure (integer constant of the Counter). Since you are using a Transformer 80/5A, the ratio is 16 (primary divided by the secondary of the transformer). Now you know the transformation ratio, it's possible to select the correct pulse value for unit from technical data sheet of the MID-XMC3F.

As shown on the technical datasheet, with a CT ratio of 16, the digital output of the counter will produce 200 pulses each 1 kWh. Therefore, the weight of the single pulse will be:

$$1000\text{Wh} / 200 \text{ Imp} = 5\text{Wh/Imp}.$$

By knowing this value, it's possible to calculate the parameters k/Slope and Pulse weight to insert into NG-9 PLUS and NG9/96, let's go with order.

Pulse Weight: This parameter is used by NG9/96 and/or NG9 Plus to increase the inserted value, the totalizer. Therefore, set the value of the single-pulse weight, which is 5 in the example above (5 Wh /imp).

K/Slope (or KTA in the configurator): set the “instantaneous” measurement at full scale, by considering that the maximum frequency admitted for NG-DIG is 5Hz.

It needs that you have to multiply the pulse weight for 18000 (5Hz * 3600). In this example, just insert:

$$5 \times 18000 = 90000$$

At the frequency of 5 Hz, the instantaneous measurement will be 90 kW of Power.

Offset: NG9/96 and/or NG9 Plus uses this parameter to “move” the size of an Offset. When the pulse comes from a counter, leave this parameter at “0”.

NG-DIG Digital Status

In this case, no parameter needs to be set on NG-9/96 and/or NG9 PLUS, since the only value acquired by the instrument is the status of the physical contact on the NG-DIG terminal board.

It will be essential to connect correctly the sensor to signal, by following the schemes. The pages about real-time data of NG9 PLUS will allow you to display the actual status of the Input (ON or OFF). If the system is reading signal status from Modbus registers, 0 or 1 are displayed (0 for OFF, 1 for ON).



ATTENTION !

Installation and wiring of the device must only be performed by qualified personnel. Danger of electric shock, fire and electric arc. Use personal protective equipment that is suitable for complying with actual electrical safety regulations. Before making any connections, check the disconnection of the power supply with the voltage detection device.

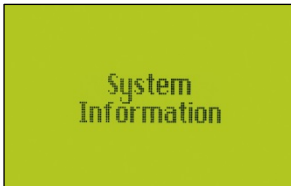
NG9 and NG9 PLUS setting by Keyboard



Jog Positions:



When the instrument is turned on, regardless of the screen displayed, click the Jog button to UP or DOWN position for scrolling the menu, until to display the main screen about system information



Click the Jog to RIGHT position to display a page showing: Serial number; calibration date; and Firmware version:



Then, by clicking UP or DOWN, the next page is displayed; it shows: Battery status; internal temperature; diagnostic code; node address (including speed b/s, parity and error codes).



By clicking RIGHT You return to main screen "System information", from which it's possible to scroll the main menu.

SETUP

In order to set all system parameters, click the Jog button on UP or DOWN until the screen of Setup is displayed:



Click the RIGHT position to display the menu about PIN entry:



In order to enter PIN code, press the Jog button: the display changes color (green) and the first digit flashes. Then, click Jog to UP or DOWN for inserting the desired number. In the next step: click RIGHT to set the second digit and repeat the procedure already explained. So even for the remaining digits. Once the procedure is finished, press the Jog button to get the access to setting menu. **(the default PIN is 0000).**

TIME SETTING

Click UP or DOWN to scroll the sub-menu. The next screen displayed is the following:



Through this menu it's possible to insert the number of meridian where the instrument is, so that the system calculates the local hour by summing this number to Greenwich hour.

Press Jog to enable the menu: it changes color (green) and the indication flashes. Click UP or DOWN to select one of these meridians, according to town:

0: London; Lisbon.

+1: Milan; Rome; Paris; Madrid; Berlin;

Wien; Prague.

+2: Athens; Cairo.

(default is CET (UTC+1)).

Click DOWN to display the menu about the daylight saving time (DST):



(default is "Enabled").

In order to change the setting, push the Jog button, then click UP or DOWN to select Enabled for summer-time; Disabled for winter-time. Press again Jog to save the settings.

Click DOWN to display the next menu, about the modality used by the instrument to determine the hour (time), according to setting entered:



By pressing Jog and clicking UP or DOWN, it's possible to select one of the following options:

Wall time:

The instrument considers the time set, including DST (default function).

Local time:

The instrument considers the winter-time as the time set.

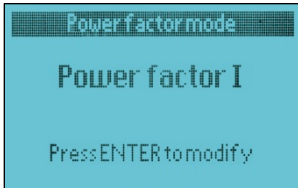
UTC time:

In this modality, the instrument considers the time set as the Greenwich time and sums it to the number of the meridian, entered in "Timezone".

Then, press Jog to confirm and return automatically to main menu.

POWER FACTOR

Click the Jog on DOWN position to scroll the main menu, until the following screen is displayed:



Then press Jog and click UP or DOWN to select the desired Power Factor:

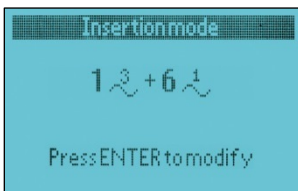
Power factor I. When the power factor is displayed, the algebraic sign is determined by the active power: positive if it's absorbed; negative if it's delivered.

Power factor II. When the power factor is displayed, the algebraic sign is determined by the reactive power: positive if it's inductive; negative if it's capacitive (default function).

Press Jog to confirm.

CONNECTION SETTING

Click DOWN to scroll the main menu until to display the screen about the insertion mode, according to the plant:



The indication shows the typology of connection, in the plant considered. In order to change it, press Jog for enabling the function, then click UP or DOWN to select one of the following configurations:

3 3 + 0 1: Plant made up of 3 Three-phase systems, no Single-phase system. As shown on the Example A), (default function).

2 3 + 3 1: Plant made up of 2 Three-phase systems and 3 Single-phase system. As shown on the Example B) (NG9 and NG9 Plus, Connections).

1 3 + 6 1: Plant made up of 1 Three-phase system and 6 Single-phase system. As shown on the Example C) (NG9 and NG9 Plus, Connections).

0 3 + 9 1: No Three-phase system, the plant is made up of 9 Single-phase systems. As shown on the Example D), (NG9 and NG9 Plus, Connections).

At the end, press Jog to save the setting and return automatically to main menu.

TPOLOGY OF SENSORS

Click DOWN to scroll the menu, until to display the screen about the procedure to enable the channels and the sensor connected, beginning from the first channel (L1)



As previously described, press the Jog button to enable the menu, then click DOWN to select one of the following options:

Disabled: to disable the data-reading on the channel (default function).

Reserved: factory mode, only used in the laboratory in order to carry out some calibrations.

Repeatedly press DOWN to scroll all the sensors supported and select the installed one. The classes of sensors are the followings:

RG8K: Rogowski Probe with maximum value supported 8000A.

Full-scale selectable: 400, 800, 1600, 4000, 8000A

RG4K: Rogowski Probe with maximum value supported 4000A.

Full-scale selectable: 200, 400, 800, 2000, 4000A

RG2K: Rogowski Probe with maximum value supported 2000A.

Full-scale selectable: 100, 200, 400, 1000, 2000A

RG-500: Rogowski Probe with maximum value supported 500A.

Full-scale selectable: 50, 100, 250, 500A

CC24: Current Transformer with output in voltage, diameter 24 mm.

Full-scale selectable: 200, 100, 40, 20A

CC16: Current Transformer with output in voltage, diameter 16 mm.

Fondo-scala selezionabile: 100, 40, 20, 10A

CC06: Current Transformer with output in voltage, diameter 6 mm.

Full-scale selectable: 10, 5, 2, 1A

For each class it's possible to select the Full-scale value of the current.

ONLY FOR NG9-PLUS:

Features: See the Chapter:

"Sensors for NG9 Plus and NG9/96"

AIN 4-20mA: Sensor to acquire Current signals in the range 4÷20mA.

AIN 20mA/10V: Sensor to acquire signals in the range:

±10V, 0÷10V, ±20mA, 4÷20mA

RTD: Sensor for temperature measurements from probes PT100

DIGITAL States:

When the sensor NG-DIG is connected, select this function to acquire pulses related to digital states of the contacts.

DIGITALE Counter: When The NG-DIG sensor is connected, select this function if the pulse source is a counter or a similar instrument. The pulses are processed.

At the end press Jog to store the setting. With the same procedure described, set other channels, each of them is displayed at the next pressure of DOWN, up to L9.

PHASE ASSIGNMENT TO EACH CHANNEL

The assignment of a determined phase to the respective channel is not so restrictive as in the example on the diagrams, but freely selectable.

For example: the channel L1 can also be assigned to phase S or T, not only R. The same thing for the other channels.
(default is: V1(R); V2(S); V3(T)).

In order to set a phase, scroll the main menu by clicking the Jog on the position UP or DOWN, until the following screen is displayed



This menu shows the voltage channel L1, assigned to phase R. In order to assign it to a different phase (S or T), press the Jog button and the screen changes, as shown below:

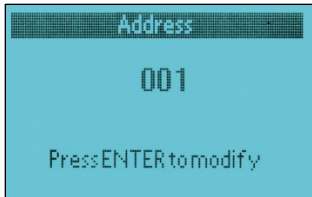


Click UP or DOWN to select the desired phase, then press Jog to save the setting. The display shows the initial color (blue) and the indication of the new phase for L1.

Repeat this procedure for the other channels, selected by clicking DOWN, until L9.

NETWORK PARAMETERS

Click the Jog button on the positions UP or DOWN to scroll the menu, until to display the screen about the **node address** (default is 001):



In order to change it, press the Jog button, the screen changes color (as seen previously) and the cursor flashes. Click RIGHT to bring the cursor on the first digit, then click UP or DOWN to enter a number from 0 to 9. In the next step, click RIGHT to bring the cursor on the second digit and repeat the procedure described, so for all digits. At the end, press Jog to save the setting.

Click DOWN to display the next screen about the **communication speed** (in bit per second):



In order to change it, press Jog and click UP or DOWN to select one of the following values: 115200; 57600; 38400; 19200; 9600. Then, press Jog to confirm.

All the instruments connected must have the same speed.

(default is 57600).

Click DOWN to display the next menu about the **Parity** code:



In the package of bits in which the signal is divided, the desired parity code can be set by using the same procedure described in the above paragraph, about the communication speed. Select "Even", "Odd" or "None".

(default is Even).

Click DOWN to display the next menu about the **stop bit**:



By using the same procedure described, select the stop bit between 1 or 2. (default is 1).

PIN CHANGE

Click DOWN to display the next menu about the change of **PIN code**:



By using the same procedure above described (see "node address"), insert the digits of the new PIN code if You don't want to keep the default value.

ATTENTION:

Once the PIN has been set, if you forget it, will NOT be possible to access the instrument configuration, even with the Configurator!

ENERGY MULTIPLIER

The value refers to "step" or "increase in energy" displayed by the meter during the measurement, below which it keeps the last value; the next measurement value will be displayed every time that the increase exceeds the setting.

For example: if the value entered is 10Wh and the instrument starts from 0, the value 0 will be always displayed when the energy recorded is below 10Wh; but when the energy reaches this threshold, the display will show 10Wh and so on, in increments of 10, displaying: 10, 20, 30, 40, etc.

Scroll the main by clicking the Jog on UP or DOWN, until the following screen is displayed:



Press the Jog button to enable it, then click UP or DOWN to insert the desired value among the followings: 1Wh; 10Wh; 100Wh; 1KWh; Then press Jog to confirm.

DIRECTION OF THE ENERGY

Click the Jog button on DOWN position to display the menu about the direction of the measured energy:



Press Jog to enable it, then click UP or DOWN to insert the option according to the plant in which the instrument is installed:

Bidirectional:

To measure both the energy absorbed by the electrical network (positive value) and the energy delivered to the electrical network (negative value).

(Default function).

Unidirectional: To measure only the energy produced or the energy absorbed.

At the end, press Jog to save the setting.

CONSTANT TV

By clicking DOWN, the next menu displayed is the following:



For voltage measurements, if a transformer is inserted, set the Voltmetric constant. In the absence of transformer, set 100.0V/100V: under these conditions, the range of the values displayed on the menu, coincides with those reported in the table of technical data, precisely:

430 V peak, phase-neutral
300 Vac phase-neutral
520 Vac phase-phase

The procedure for inserting the values through Jog command is the same described in the paragraph "node address". **(default is 100.0V/100V)**

ONLY FOR NG9-PLUS:

SETUP WITH NG-AIN SENSOR

If connecting a NG-AIN analog sensor to a channel, you must set two parameters: k/Slope and Offset.

Click DOWN to scroll the menu until to display the parameter k/Slope in the interested channel (Example: L1k/Slope) and enable it by pressing ENTER.

k/Slope

It represents the Full-scale of the values within the desired analog scale. The formula is the following:

$$(\text{Maximum value} - \text{Minimum value}) / I$$

Where "I" is the internal constant, in this case is 1.

Press ENTER to confirm. Then scroll the menu by clicking DOWN to repeat (if necessary) the operation also for other channels. Always using DOWN, scroll the menu until to display the "**Offset**" parameter (Example: L1Offset) as displayed.

Offset

It represents the Maximum value on the whole range; in order to set this parameter, enter the minimum value of the analog scale that is being measured.

Press ENTER to enable the screen, then enter the value using the same procedure with Joystick described initially.

Press ENTER to confirm and DOWN to scroll the other channels in the menu and, if necessary, repeat the operation.

EXAMPLE:

We suppose to connect a solarimeter with 4÷20 mA in output and we want to acquire the values of irradiation.

We know the range:

Maximum range: 1200 W/m²

Minimum range: 0 W/m²

K/Slope is (1200-0) = 1200

Offset is 0

If we want to acquire the solarimeter Temperature and we know the range of the instrument:

Tmax = 180 °C; Tmin = -40 °C

K/Slope is [180-(-40)] = 220

Offset is -40

This example is valid for every type of analog measurement and analog range that can be acquired. Just remember to take the correct parameters before starting the configuration.

SETUP WITH NG-DIG SENSOR

Through NG-DIG sensor it's possible to acquire digital signals or digital states from different sources.

In the Setup menu about the interested channel you can select two different Setup typologies for NG-DIG:

Digital counter and digital states,
(Rif. Paragraph: "Typology of sensors").

To configure the sensor so that it acquires digital states, you must set two different parameters: K/Slope and Pulse Weight.

Scroll the menu by clicking DOWN until to display the interested channel, on which the NG-DIG module is connected (Example: L1).

It's displayed as: "**L1 k/Slope**".

k/Slope: In this case, it represents the constant applied by the instrument in order to calculate the real-time value and transform correctly the number of incoming pulses into the desired unit of measure.

Press ENTER to enable the screen and enter the value. Then press again ENTER to confirm.

Then scroll the menu until to display the screen about the pulse weight for the interested channel.

On the top side of the display (Example: L1), is shown the indication "**L1 Pulse Weight**"

Pulse Weight:

It corresponds to number of the pulses acquired, for each unit of measure detected.

Press ENTER to enable the screen and enter the value. Press again ENTER to confirm.

Then click DOWN to scroll the same parameter on the others channels, repeating the operation if necessary.

COSTANT TA

Similarly to the voltages, even for the Currents insert the amperometric constant if a Current Transformer is connected on the interested channel. To access to corresponding screen, click DOWN to scroll the menu until to display:



By using the same procedure described in the paragraph "node address", insert the correct value of the constant, according to Current Transformer used. At the end, by clicking DOWN, it's possible to set the constant of Current Transformers also for other channels, and so on, from L1 to L9.
(default is 1.000A/A)

ENTER NAME

Click UP or DOWN to scroll the menu until to display the screen about the name for each current channel, called LABEL:

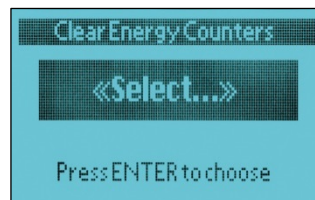


The procedure for changing the name is the same described in the paragraph "node address". In this case, besides the numbers, it's also possible to select the letters and the symbols. Maximum length of the word is 8 characters.

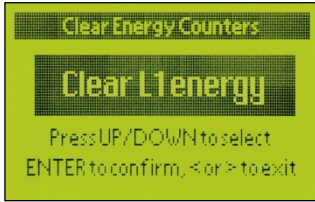
Once stored, repeat the procedure for the other channels. You can display the menu relative to each channel (from L1 to L9) by clicking DOWN.

CLEARING OF THE ENERGY METERS

In order to clear all the values of energy stored in the meters, relative to each channel, click UP or DOWN to display the following menu:



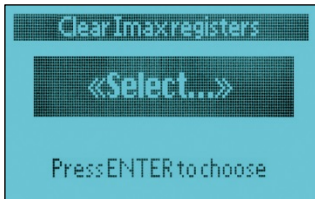
Press the Jog button. The screen (the first is the channel L1), changes as shown below:



Click repeatedly the Jog button on UP or DOWN position to scroll all the channels until L9. Stop on the interested channel and press Jog. You will be asked to confirm; press again Jog. The values stored in the record of the meter, relative to interested channel, will be cleared. Then, automatically, the blue screen of the main menu will be displayed. You can repeat the procedure also for other channels.

CLEARING OF THE MAXIMUM CURRENT REGISTERS

In order to clear all the values of the maximum current, stored in the registers relative to each channel, click the Jog button on DOWN to display the next screen:



The procedure is the same described above for clearing the energy records. The only difference is in the typology of data: in this case, the peak values of the currents.

SETTING AND RESTARTING

Click the Jog button on DOWN, the screen displayed is the following:



Press the Jog button to enable it, then click UP or DOWN to select one of these options:

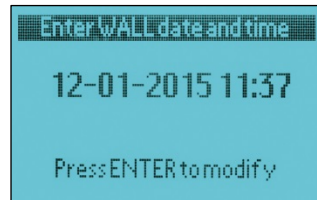
Set default setup: to clean the last settings and activate automatically the factory settings.

Reboot: to restart the instrument.

Press Jog to confirm the selected option.

DATE AND TIME SETTING

Click display the screen about date and time setting:



Press the Jog button to enable it. The color changes (green) and a cursor flashes on the first digit.

The procedure to enter the values is the same described at the beginning of the paragraph:

"Network parameters" (Node address).

CONTRAST

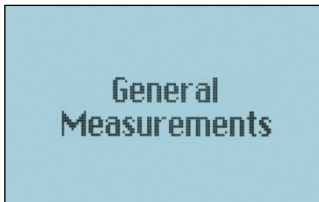
Click the Jog button on DOWN position; the last Setup screen displayed concerns the contrast on the display:



Press Jog to enable the function, then click the Jog to RIGHT or LEFT position, respectively to increase or decrease the contrast. Contemporarily you note the shape drawn by the slider that varies in length, according to the value of contrast. Press Jog to confirm.

GENERAL MEASUREMENTS

Returning to main menu shown when the instrument was turned on, click the Jog button on UP or DOWN position until to display the following screen:



Click RIGHT to get the access to a sub-menu in which, by clicking UP or DOWN, you can display alternatively two pages showing all the parameters about the three-phase measurements:

Phase-voltage (U_1 ; U_2 ; U_3), average phase voltage (V_{Δ}), Star-voltage for each couple of phases (U_{12} ; U_{23} ; U_{31}), Average star-voltage (U_{Δ}), Network frequency (F), Internal temperature in the instrument (T).

Click RIGHT to get the access to a sub-menu in which, by clicking UP or DOWN, you can display the pages showing all the parameters about the measurement on each phase channel.

The first page of the connected channel shows the following measurements:

By clicking again the Jog button to RIGHT position You can see the last page of the same channel, showing 4 Reactive Energy Meters: each of them is referred to a determined quadrant and it begins to record the values according to direction of the Active and reactive Power, if the vector of the Apparent Power is in the area of the corresponding quadrant.

Precisely: Active and Reactive Energy together positive (absorbed): Q1 starts. Active Energy negative (delivered) and Reactive Energy positive: Q2 starts. Active and Reactive Energy together negative: Q3 starts. Active Energy Positive and Reactive Energy negative: Q4 starts.

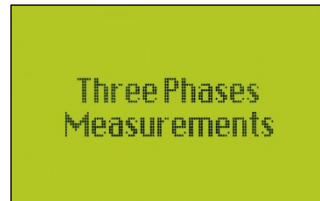

Click LEFT to return to previous page of the same channel.

THREE-PHASE MEASUREMENTS

From main menu, click UP or DOWN to display the following screen:



Click RIGHT to get the access to a sub-menu about the measurements on all three-phase systems connected.

In the present three-phase systems, you can scroll through the screens for each of them, named according to the group of three current channels connected.

For example: By setting the instrument for 2 three-phase systems and 3 single-phase systems, you can see the screen named as L123 and L456, each of them corresponds to respective three-phase connection. Instead, for L789, a message of "modality not enabled" is displayed.

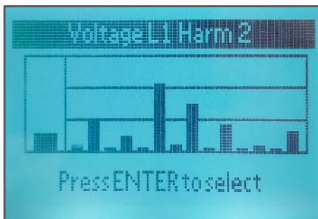

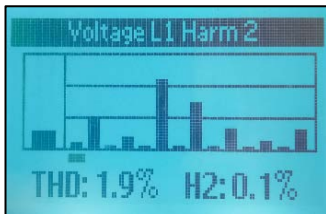

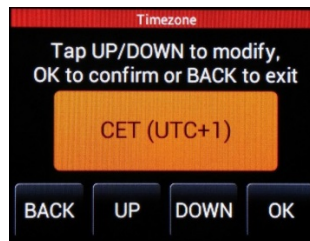

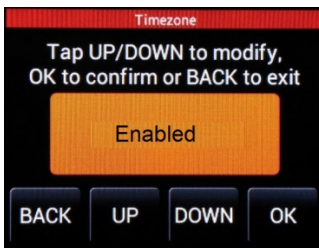

The first three channels (L1, L2, L3) are current inputs. Through the corresponding screen you can set the parameters about the Current Transformers connected.

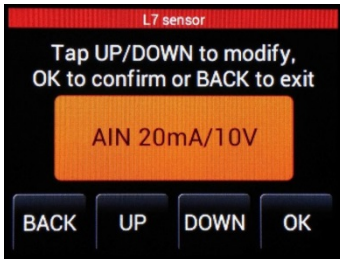

Use the same procedure for L2 and L3 channels.

DIGITAL Counter: When NG-DIG sensor is connected, select this function if the pulse source is a counter or a similar instrument. The pulses are processed.

Disabled: to disable the data-reading on the channel.

Calculated: When using only 2 current sensors on a three-phase line without neutral, it calculates automatically the third current.

At the end, Tap OK confirm, or BACK to return to previous screen without saving.

PHASE ASSIGNMENT TO EACH CHANNEL

The assignment of a determined phase to the respective channel is not so restrictive as in the examples of the wiring diagrams, but freely selectable.

For example: the channel L1 can also be assigned to phase S or T, not only R. The same thing for the other channels. (default is: V1(R); V2(S); V3(T)).

In order to set a phase, scroll the menu by tapping UP or DOWN, until to display the following screen:



This menu shows the voltage channel L1, assigned to phase R. In order to assign it to a different phase (S or T), tap the yellow area, the screen changes as previously described.

Tap UP or DOWN to select the desired phase, then tap OK to save the setting. The display shows the indication of the new phase for L1.

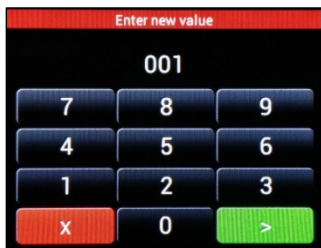
This procedure is the same for the other channels, selected by tapping DOWN, until L9.

NETWORK PARAMETERS

Always on the Setting menu, Tap DOWN to scroll it, until to display the screen about the node address (default è 001):



Tap the yellow area display the keyboard, through which it's possible to enter the new node address:



Then, tap ">" to confirm or "X" to exit without saving.

Tap DOWN to display the next screen about the **communication speed** (in bit per second):



In order to change it, tap the yellow area, then tap UP or DOWN to select one of the following values: 115200; 57600; 38400; 19200; 9600.

(default is 57600). Tap OK to confirm.

All the instruments connected must have the same speed.

Tap DOWN to display the next screen about the **Parity** code:



To change the parity code on display, use the same procedure above described about the communication speed. Select "Even", "Odd" or "None". (default is Even).

Tap DOWN to display the next menu about the **stop bit**:



By using the same procedure previously described, select the stop bit between 1 or 2. **(default is 1).**

PIN CHANGE

Tap DOWN to display the next screen about the change of **PIN code**:



By using the same procedure above described, enter the digits of the new PIN code if you don't want to keep the default value.

ATTENTION: Once the PIN has been set, if you forget it, will NOT be possible to access the instrument configuration, even with the Configurator!

ENERGY MULTIPLIER

The value refers to "step" or "increase in energy" displayed by the counter during the measurement, below which it keeps the last value. The next measurement value will be displayed every time that the increase exceeds the setting.

For example: if the value entered is 10Wh and the instrument starts from 0, the value 0 will be always displayed when the energy recorded is below 10Wh; but when the energy reaches this threshold, the display will show 10Wh and so on, in increments of 10, displaying: 10, 20, 30, 40, etc.. (default is 1 Wh).

Tap DOWN to scroll the menu, until the following page is displayed:



By using the same procedure above described (tap the yellow area and then scroll the values through UP or DOWN), enter the desired value among the followings:

1Wh; 10Wh; 100Wh; 1KWh; Then tap OK to confirm.

DIRECTION OF ENERGY

Tap DOWN, the next page refers to direction of the measured energy:



Tap the yellow area to enable it, then tap UP or DOWN to select the option according to the plant in which the instrument is installed:

Unidirectional: To measure only the energy produced or the energy absorbed.

Bidirectional (Default function):

To measure both the energies: absorbed by the electrical network (positive value) and delivered to the electrical network (negative value).

At the end, tap OK to save the setting.

CONSTANT TV

Tap DOWN, the next page displayed is the following:



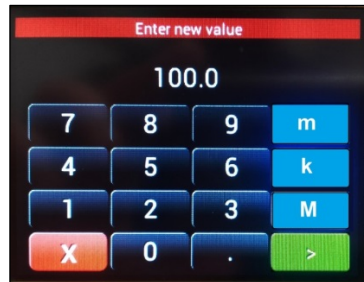
For voltage measurements, if a transformer is inserted, set the Voltmetric constant. In the absence of transformer, set 100.0V/100V: under these conditions, the range of the values displayed on the menu, coincide with those reported in the table of technical data, precisely:

430 V peak, phase-neutral

300 Vac phase-neutral

520 Vac phase-phase

In order to change it, tap the yellow area. The following keyboard is displayed: **(default is 100.0V/100V)**:



Enter the desired value.

The blue keys indicating "m, k, M" are useful to enter the value directly expressed by the multiple or sub-multiple of the main unit. Precisely: "m" = milli; "k" = kilo; "M" = Mega.

For each of them, tap a first time to enable the multiple (or sub-multiple), tap a second time to disable it, as will be shown to display.

Then, tap ">" to confirm, or "X" to exit and return to preview page.

SETUP WITH NG-AIN SENSOR

Once selected the analog sensor type for the specific measure, you need to configure two parameters: k/Slope and Offset.

k/Slope

It represents the full scale of values inside the desired analog scale. The formula is the following:

$$(\text{Maximum value} - \text{Minimum value})$$

where "1" is the internal constant, in this case it's 1.

Offset

It represents the minimum value of the entire range; to set this parameter you need to enter the minimum value of the analog scale you are measuring.

EXAMPLE:

Let's suppose to wire a solarimeter with 4÷20 mA analog outputs and we want to acquire the Irradiation measurement. We know the range:

Maximum range: 1200 W/m²

Minimum range: 0 W/m²

K/Slope is (1200-0) /1 = 1200

Offset è 0

If we want to acquire solarimeter Temperature, knowing the range of the instrument:

Tmax = 180°C; Tmin = -40°C

K/Slope is [180-(-40)] /1 = 220

Offset is -40

This example is valid for every kind of analog measure and analog range acquirable. Just remember to take correct parameters before starting the configuration.

Tap DOWN to scroll the previous menu, until to display the page related to K/Slope on the interested channel, in which the NG-AIN sensor is wired.



Enter the new value through the keyboard displayed (same as the keyboard at page 37 for TV Constant).

Tap ">" to confirm, or "X" to exit and return to previous page.

Then, tap repeatedly DOWN until to display the page of the same channel, but related to Offset parameter:



Using the same procedure described, enter the Offset value.

SETUP WITH NG-DIG SENSOR

With NG-DIG sensor you can acquire digital signals or digital states from different sources.

Inside the channel sensor setup menu, you can select two different kinds of NG-DIG setup:

Digital counter and Digital state,
(Already described in the paragraph: "TIPOLOGY OF SENSORS").

In order to configure the sensor to acquire digital signals, you need to set two different parameters:

K/Slope and Pulse Weight.

k/Slope: In this case it represents the constant that the instrument applies to calculate the real time value and correctly transform the number of pulses incoming into the desired unit of measure.

Pulse Weight: It corresponds to the number of acquired pulses for every unit of measure acquired.

Tap DOWN to scroll the previous menu, until to display the page related to K/Slope on the interested channel, in which the NG-DIG sensor is wired.



Tap the yellow area to display the keyboard and enter the value of K/Slope

Tap ">" to confirm, or "X" to exit and return to previous page.

Then, tap repeatedly DOWN until to display the page of the same channel, but related to Pulse Weight:



Using the same procedure just described, enter the value of the pulse weight.

ENTER NAME

Tap UP or DOWN to scroll the menu until to display the page about the name for each channel, called LABEL:



In order to change it, tap the yellow area. The following keyboard is displayed:



Enter the name to be assigned to the channel. If You want to enter also numbers, tape the key "1&!", a numerical keyboard will be displayed, with the key "ABC" for returning to main keyboard.

At the end, tap "OK" to save, or "X" to return to main menu without saving.

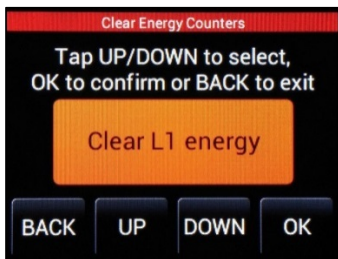
Once stored, repeat the procedure for the other channels (L1÷L9) by scrolling the menu with DOWN key.

CLEAR ENERGY COUNTERS

In order to clear all the values of energy stored in the counters (relative to each channel) tap UP or DOWN until to display the following screen:



Tap the yellow area, the screen changes as shown:



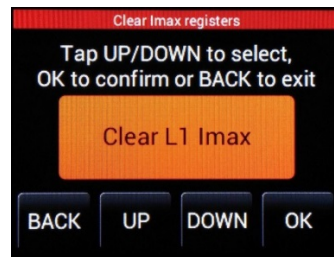
Tap repeatedly UP or DOWN to scroll all the channels until L9. Stop on the interested channel and tap OK. You will be asked to confirm; tap again OK to execute. The values stored in the record of the counter, relative to interested channel, will be cleared. You can repeat the procedure also for other channels.

CLEAR THE MAXIMUM CURRENT RECORDS

In order to clear all the values of the maximum currents stored in the registers related to each channel, tap DOWN to display the next screen:



Tap the yellow area. The page changes as shown:



The procedure is the same described above for clearing the energy counters. The only difference is in the typology of data: in this case is the peak values of the current.

SETTING AND RESTARTING

Tap DOWN, the next page displayed is the following:



Tap the yellow area to enable it, the page changes. On the menu shown, through UP or DOWN it's possible to select these options:

Set default setup: to clean the last settings and activate automatically the factory settings.

Reboot: to restart the instrument.

Tap OK to confirm the selected option.

DATE AND TIME SETTING

Tap DOWN to display the screen about date and time setting:



Tap the yellow area to enable it. The page changes as shown:

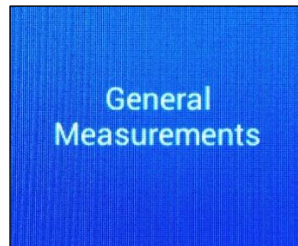


Tap the orange area corresponding to interested field. Through the keyboard shown, enter the desired value. Then tap OK to save the setting and return to above menu.

Repeat the procedure for the other fields. At the end, tap OK to save all the changes and BACK to return to menu.

GENERAL MEASUREMENTS

Returning to main menu shown when the instrument was turned on, tap the UP or DOWN side until to display the following screen:



Tap the RIGHT side on the screen to access to a sub-menu. The main page shows all the parameters about the three-phase measurements:

Phase-Neutral voltage (L1, L2, L3);
Phase-Phase voltage (L1-L2, L2-L3, L3-L1);
Average Phase-Neutral Voltage (3PH Line-Neutral);
Average Phase-Phase Voltage (3PH Line-Line):



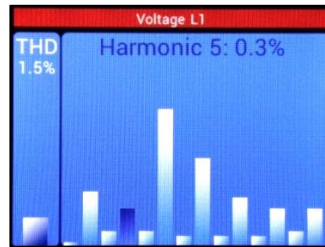
Tap the UP side to display the page with the frequency and the internal temperature:



HARMONICS

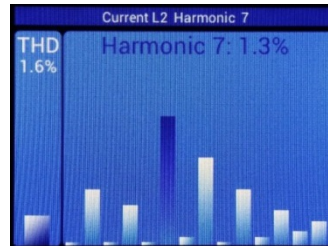
In the menu "General Measurements" above illustrated, it's also possible to see the distribution of harmonics on each channel.

Tap the UP or DOWN side to scroll the menu, until to display the page of the harmonics on a channel:



The left box shows the Total Harmonic Distortion on this channel, instead the right box shows the harmonics distribution and, automatically, it indicates from 2nd to 15th the percentage of the corresponding harmonic.

Tap the center area to read only the percentage value of an interested harmonic, the red bar changes in blue, as in the example below:



Tap again the center area for returning to previous screen (with red bar above).

Tap the RIGHT or LEFT sides to scroll the other channels. It's possible to see the harmonics on the Voltage channels (voltage L1+L3) and the Current channels (Current L1+L9).

Tap DOWN side to scroll the menu, until to display the page about the vector diagram:

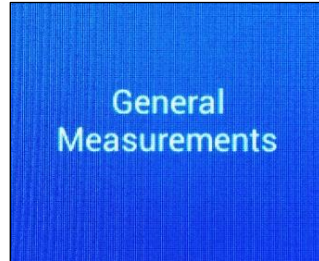


It shows, in real time, the vector diagram of the three-phase electrical sizes on the system, such as: phase-phase voltages, phase-neutral voltages, line current, with the phase angles. All the sizes are shown in different colors for easy identification.

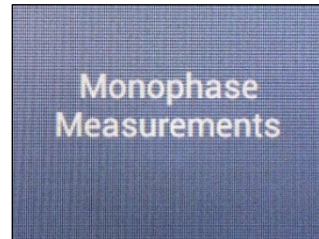

Tap RIGHT to display the next page of the same channel, where you can see respectively the counters for: Absorbed Active Energy (A+) and Delivered Active Energy to the network (A-):



By tapping again the RIGHT side you can see the last page of the same channel, showing 4 Reactive Energy counters: each of them is referred to a determined quadrant and it begins to record the values according to direction of the Active and Reactive Power, if the vector of the Apparent Power is in the area of the corresponding quadrant.

Precisely: Active and Reactive Energy together positive (absorbed): Q1 starts. Active Energy negative (delivered) and Reactive Energy positive: Q2 starts. Active and Reactive Energy together negative: Q3 starts. Active Energy Positive and Reactive Energy negative: Q4 starts.

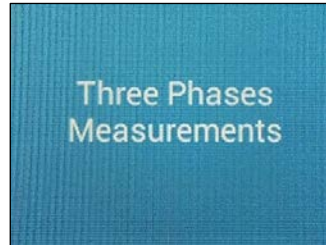
For each of the pages relative to a determined channel (in this example L1), tap the UP or DOWN side to see the same page, but related to a different channel (from L1 to L9).

If, during the channel setting, someone wasn't enabled, the corresponding page will show the message: "modality not enabled".

Tap the LEFT side for returning to previous page of the same channel.

THREE PHASE MEASUREMENTS

From main menu, tap UP or DOWN side to display the following screen:



Tap the RIGHT side to access to a sub-menu about the measurements on all three-phase systems connected.

If the three-phase systems are connected, you can scroll the screens for each of them, named according to the group of three current channels connected

For example: By setting the instrument for 2 three-phase systems and 3 single-phase systems, as shown on the scheme at page 23, you can see the screen named as L123 and L456, each of them corresponds to respective three-phase connection. Instead, for L789, a message of "modality not enabled" is displayed.

The first page displayed is the following:



It shows these values:

Average Phase Voltage; Average Star Voltage; Average Current; Overall Active Power; Overall Reactive Power; Overall Apparent Power; Power Factor.

Tap the RIGHT side to display the next page of the same Three phase system, where you can see respectively the counters of: Overall Active Energy Absorbed (A+) and Overall Active Energy Delivered to the

Network (A-):



Tap again RIGHT side to display the last page of the same Three-phase system, showing 4 Reactive Energy meters: each of them is referred to a determined quadrant and it begins to record the values according to direction of the Active and Reactive Power, if the vector of the Apparent Power is in the area of the corresponding quadrant. The principle is the same as that explained in the paragraph for single-phase systems.



Tap the UP or DOWN side to see the same page, but related at a different three-phase system.

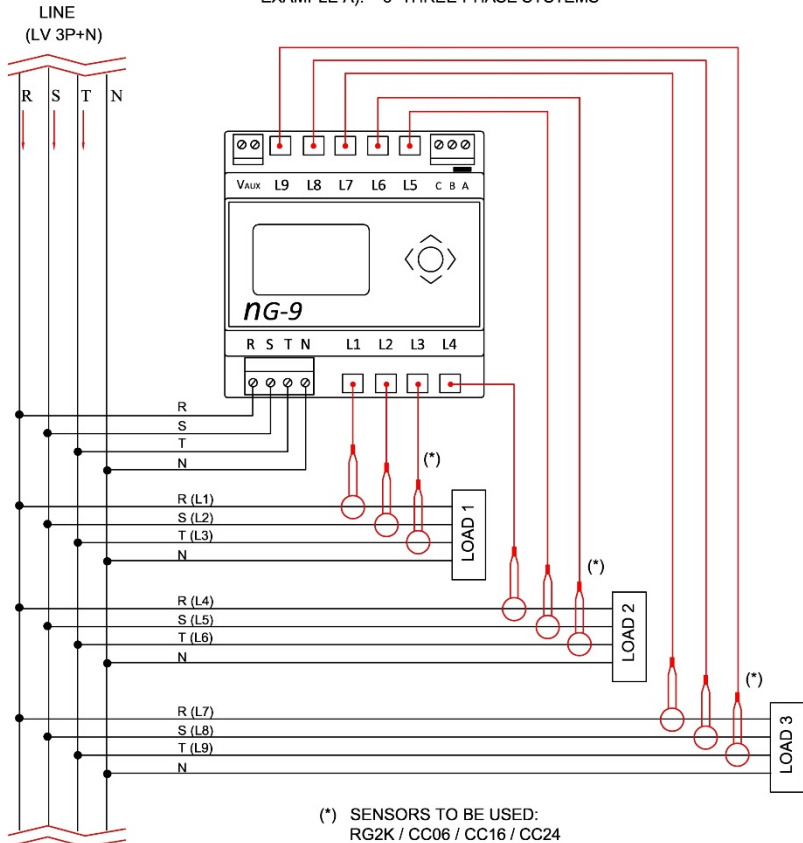

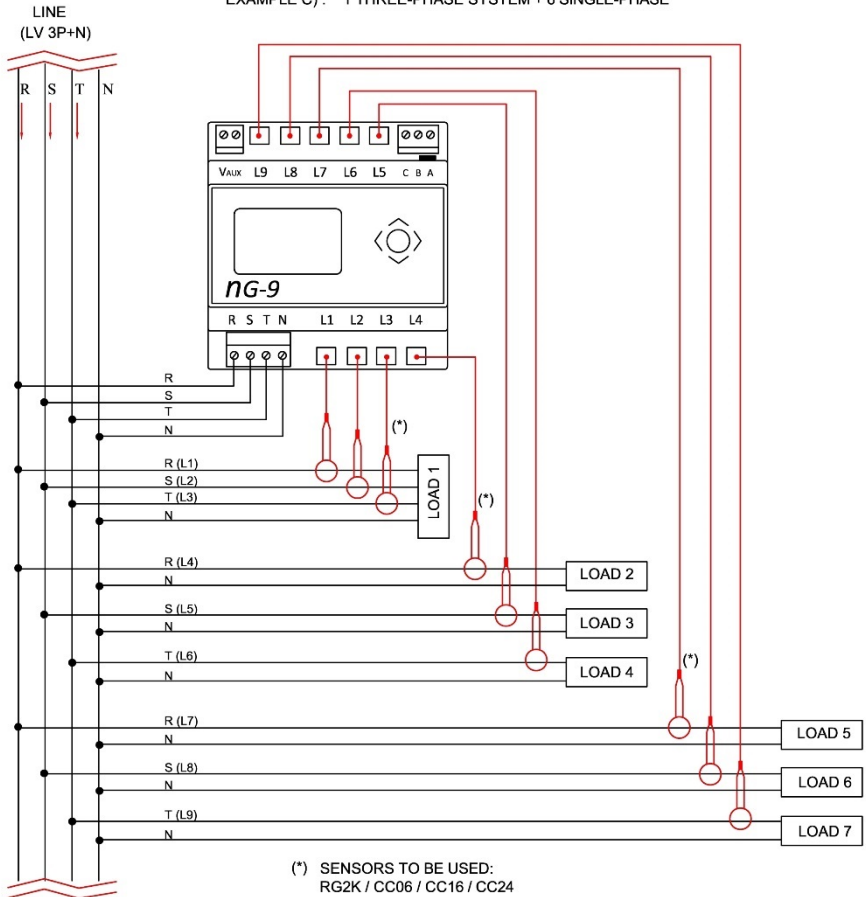

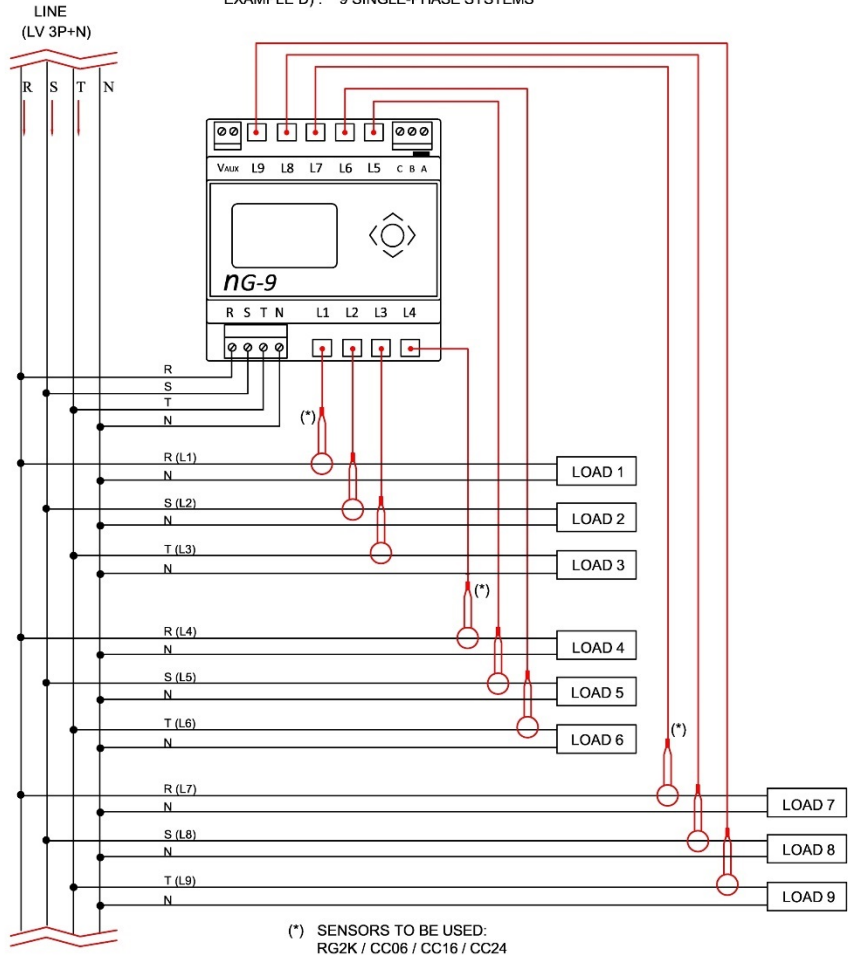

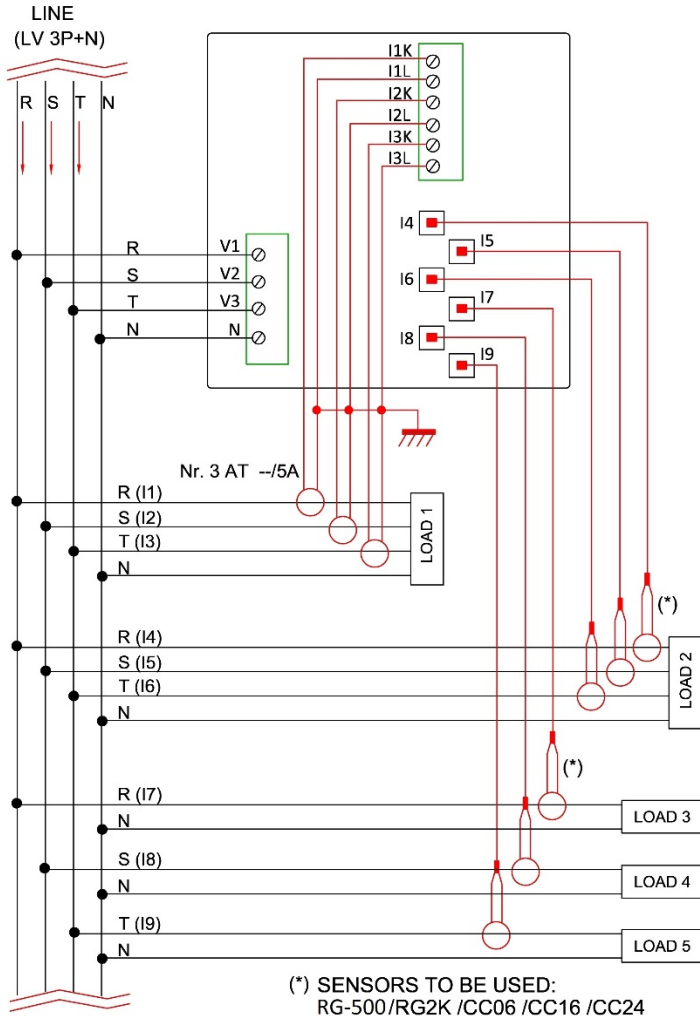


NG9/96 – Examples of wiring

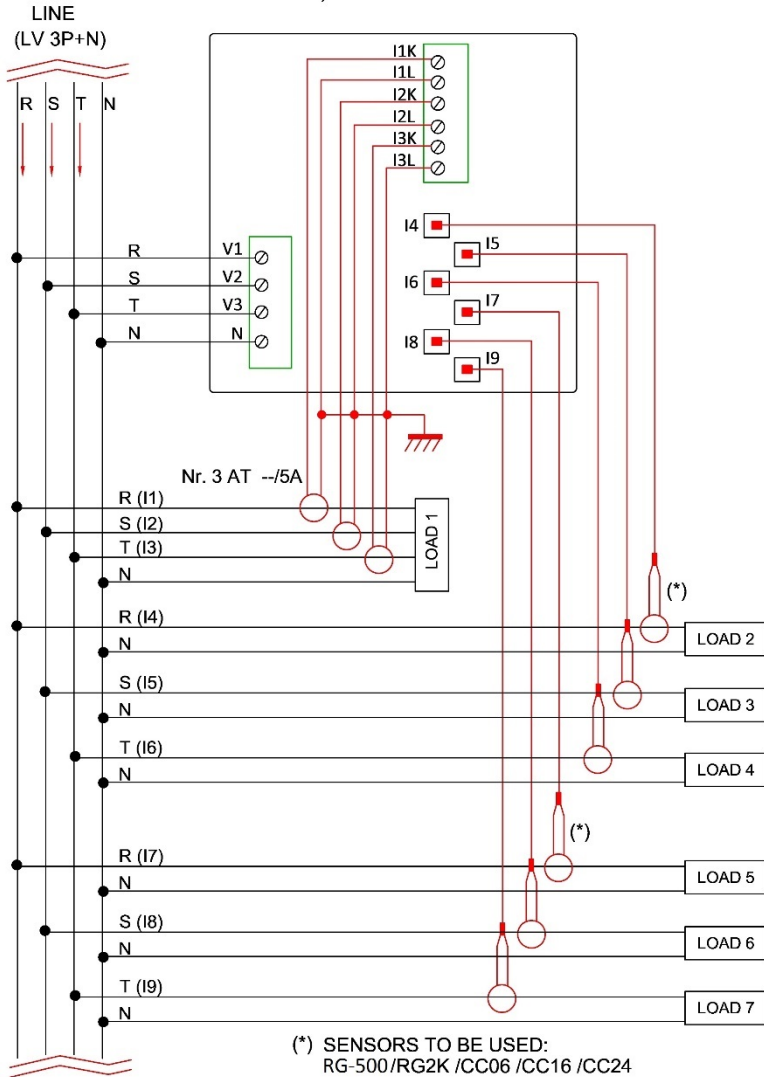
